### **SYNOPSIS**

#### Act I

The King of Denmark has died and the succession has passed to his brother Claudius rather than his son Hamlet. Gertrude, widow of the old King and mother to Hamlet, is crowned for the second time by her new husband Claudius. Hamlet is lamenting how quickly Gertrude has remarried when Ophélie arrives, questioning him about his decision to leave court. Hamlet confesses that he still loves her and will not leave. He then promises her brother Laërte that he will look after Ophélie while Laërte is in Norway. As midnight approaches, Hamlet meets Horatio and Marcellus on the battlements, who report their previous sighting of the ghost of the late King. Midnight strikes, and the ghost appears again, telling Hamlet that Claudius killed his father, and exhorting him to take revenge on Claudius whilst sparing Gertrude.

#### Act II

Ophélie wonders why Hamlet has become so cold towards her. Gertrude approaches and convinces Ophélie that Hamlet still loves her. Claudius and Gertrude speculate as to whether Hamlet has discovered their crime. Hamlet announces that he has ordered a theatrical presentation that evening, which reassures Claudius that the Prince knows nothing.

Hamlet instructs the players that they will present 'The Murder of Gonzague', which deliberately bears a close similarity to the crimes revealed to Hamlet by the ghost. At the play that evening, the King reacts strongly to the play, convincing Hamlet of his guilt. Feigning madness, Hamlet denounces Claudius, accusing him of murder.

#### Act III

Alone in Gertrude's apartment, Hamlet is disturbed by the arrival of Claudius, who prays in remorse for the murder of his brother. Catching a glimpse of Hamlet, Claudius thinks he has seen the spectre of the late King. Polonius, Ophélie's father, arrives to reassure the King, but their conversation convinces the listening Hamlet that Polonius was an accomplice to the

Ophélie and Gertrude enter, and attempt to convince Hamlet to marry Ophélie. Now knowing about Polonius' actions, Hamlet cannot bring himself to marry the daughter of someone he must kill. The rejected Ophélie leaves mother and son alone. Hamlet ferociously questions Gertrude, attempting to force her to confess. The Ghost appears to Hamlet and unseen by Gertrude, reminds Hamlet not to carry out vengeance on his mother.

#### Act IV

Beside a lake in the countryside, Ophélie appears. She has gone mad, believing herself married to Prince Hamlet.

#### Act V

A pair of gravediggers are at work but cannot tell Hamlet whose grave they are digging. Hamlet is on the run from assassins, and does not yet know that Ophélie has died. Laërte arrives, consumed with anger at Hamlet, and challenges Hamlet to a duel. Hamlet is wounded.

A funeral cortege interrupts them, which is eventually revealed to be Ophélie's. Whilst Hamlet is still coming to terms with her death, the Ghost appears and galvanises Hamlet to denounce and kill Claudius. Hamlet is proclaimed King of Denmark.



#### Adrian Kelly

Conductor


Adrian studied at the University of Cambridge and the Royal Northern College of Music, was a member of the Young Artists Programme at the Royal Opera House and then became coach at the Hamburg State Opera. From 2010-2019 he was first Kapellmeister and then Music Director at the Salzburg Landestheater. Noteworthy productions in Salzburg include Krenek's Jonny spielt auf, Verdi's Rigoletto, Massenet's

Werther and a cycle of Mozart's Da Ponte operas. He has been Artistic Director of Buxton International Festival since 2019, and Head of the International Opera Studio at Zurich Opera since the start of the 2020/2021 season. In Zurich he has conducted performances of Mozart's Don Giovanni, Donizetti's Viva la mamma, and Rihm's Jakob Lenz.

#### Frederick Brown

Chorus Master and Assistant Conductor

Frederick Brown is a pianist and conductor from Cornwall. He is Chorus Master and a staff conductor at Welsh National Opera, for whom he has conducted performances of Will Todd's Alys in Wonderland, Mozart's The Magic Flute, Don Giovanni, Così fan Tutte and Le Nozze di Figaro, Verdi's La Traviata and Rossini's Il Barbiere di Siviglia, as well as gala concerts and concerts for children. He previously worked as a repetiteur at the Hamburg Staatsoper and has also worked as assistant conductor for Iford Arts Festival (La Traviata, 2013) and Buxton International Festival (Lucio Silla, 2017). He trained at the University of Cambridge, the Royal Academy of Music and the National Opera Studio.



#### **Jack Furness**

Director

Jack Furness, founder and Artistic Director of Shadwell Opera, studied music at Cambridge University. In the 2015-16 season he was an Emerging Artist Director for Scottish Opera, after which he assisted directors such as Sir David McVicar, Laurent Pelly, Kasper Holten and Robert Carsen at the Royal Opera House. This season includes productions of Hansel and Gretel (Royal Academy of Music), and The Queen of Spades (Garsington Opera). Jack returns to the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden as the revival director of Turandot.

Recent directing credits include Candide (Scottish Opera); Acis, Galatea e Polifemo (London Handel Festival), Faust (Irish National Opera), Rusalka (Garsington Opera, Edinburgh International Festival); Don Giovanni (Nevill Holt Opera); Gianni Schicchi (Copenhagen Opera Festival); Dido and Aeneas (Royal Academy of Music); and for Shadwell Opera several productions including Oliver Knussen's Where the Wild Things Are (Alexandra Palace Theatre and Mariinsky Concert Hall, St Petersburg).

#### **Oscar Simms**

Assistant Director

Oscar is a young British director and facilitator. Since graduating with a First Class degree in Music from the University of Cambridge, he has assisted directors at the National Opera Studio, London Handel Festival, Waterperry Opera Festival, Royal Academy of Music and Arcola Theatre. He is a Trustee of Music & Theatre For All and is especially interested in opera

produced in community settings. He works regularly with the Pimlico Musical Foundation and in 2023 his production of Noye's Fludde brought together 200 children from local primary schools, following in-school workshops connecting Britten's opera to teaching about climate change.

#### Sami Fendall

Designer

Sami is an award-winning production designer whose work spans live performance, stage, and screen. In 2019, she was named the overall winner of the National Theatre's Linbury Prize for Stage Design. Her designs for Hotel, commissioned by Birmingham Royal Ballet, were shortlisted for the 2021 Fedora Van Cleef & Arpels Prize for Ballet. Recent and upcoming projects include a new ballet for the Paris Opera (2026), a revival of Brigadoon at


Regent's Park Open Air Theatre (2025), and a feature film project for Scottish Ballet. In 2024, Sami designed Ernani for Buxton International Festival, Averno for Stuttgart Ballet, and the musical CAKE. Her film work includes the 2023 feature Catching Dust, which premiered at the Tribeca and Raindance Film Festivals. Sami studied Stage Design at the Royal Central School of Speech and Drama.

#### Jake Wiltshire

Lighting Designer

Jake designs extensively both in the UK and worldwide. His work has been seen with major opera companies and festivals including The Royal Opera House, Welsh National Opera, New Zealand Opera, Savonlinna Opera Festival, Garsington Opera and St Galler Festspiele. In 2009 he was made an Honorary Associate of

the Royal Academy of Music (HonARAM) and in 2023 he was nominated for a Canadian Dora Mavor Moore Award for outstanding lighting design. Jake has lit several productions for Buxton International Festival, Longborough Festival and Opera Holland Park.





#### Erika Gundesen

#### Repetiteur

Canadian pianist and conductor Erika Gundesen is a graduate of the University of British Columbia and the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. She works in opera and theatre in London, England, and is currently assistant music director of the West End production *Operation Mincemeat*. Other recent credits include: *La Bohème*, *L'elisir d'amore* (Longborough); *What Dreams May* 

Come, The Snowmaiden, Blonde Eckbert (English Touring Opera); The Lehman Trilogy (National Theatre); Turandot, Salome, Lohengrin, Mavra/Pierrot lunaire, Seven Deadly Sins/Mahagonny (Royal Opera House); Broken Wings (Charing Cross Theatre); La donna del lago (Buxton); Parade, RENT, West Side Story (Vivo d'Arte).



#### Alastair Miles

Claudius, King of Denmark (Bass)

Described by The Guardian as 'The finest British bass of his generation', Alastair Miles appears regularly at London's Royal Opera House and in the UK has also sung for English National Opera, Glyndebourne, Grange Park Opera, Scottish Opera and Welsh National Opera. International engagements have taken him to the Metropolitan Opera, New York; the Salzburg Easter and Summer Festivals; the Theater an der Wien; the Wiener Staatsoper; the Flanders Opera; the


Opéra Royal de Wallonie; the Opéra de Lille; the Opéra national de Paris; the Bavarian State Opera; the Deutsche Oper, Berlin; Oper Köln; La Scala, Milan; Teatro Regio Torino; the Dutch National Opera; and the Teatro Real, Madrid. He also appears widely in concert and has made over ninety recordings, including a recital disc of Brahms and Wolf for Signum Classics, as well as a huge variety of operatic repertoire.

#### **Allison Cook**

Gertrude, Queen of Denmark (Mezzo-soprano)

A true Soprano Falcon, Allison Cook is one of today's leading interpreters of 20th century and contemporary repertoire. She created roles such as the Marquise in Francesconi's *Quartett* (Teatro alla Scala, Wiener Festwochen, Teatro Colón Buenos Aires) and Lea in Benêt Casablanca's

L'enigma de Lea (the Liceu, Barcelona). Other highlights include Ades' Powder her face (New York, La Monnaie in Brussels and Warsaw) and Brunhelda in Ramanati's Amerika (Zurich). Future projects include a return to ENO and La Monnaie.



#### **Gregory Feldmann**

Hamlet, Prince of Denmark (Baritone)

Hailed for his 'hearty, luxurious baritone' (Musical America), Gregory Feldmann appears on international opera and recital stages alike. This season he returned to Opernhaus Zürich to make his guest debut as Elviro in Handel's Serse, as well as his role debut as Mercutio in Gounod's Roméo et Juliette. He was a member of Opernhaus

Zürich's Internationales Opernstudio from 2022-24. A passionate recitalist, Gregory enjoys a 'luminous' collaboration with pianist Nathaniel LaNasa (Oberon's Grove). The prize-winning duo have performed in leading recital venues worldwide, including New York's Carnegie Hall, London's Wigmore Hall, and Paris' Musée d'Orsay.



#### **Richard Woodall**

Polonius (Bass)

Richard studied Performance Arts at Middlesex University and singing at the Guildhall School of Music. He has sung in many productions with English National Opera and Opera North. Other companies include Carl Rosa Opera, Crystal Clear Opera, London Opera Players, Heritage Opera, Opera della Luna, Opera South East, Arcadian Opera and Pavilion Opera, where his roles have included Leporello Don Giovanni, Figaro and Dr Bartolo The Marriage of Figaro, Dulcamara L'Elisir d'Amore, King Philip Don Carlos, Lord Capulet Romeo and Juliet, Harvey in Ethel Smyth's The Wreckers, and most of the bass-baritone roles in the Gilbert and Sullivan Savoy Operas.



#### Yewon Han

Ophélie, daughter of Polonius (Soprano)

Yewon Han won the Tenor Viñas International Singing Competition 2023 in Barcelona (first prize overall) and the Third Prize at the Neue Stimmen Competition 2022. As a member of the International Opera Studio at Opernhaus Zürich (2022–2024), she sung roles including Titania A Midsummer Night's Dream and Romilda Serse; she covered the title role of Lakmè and Norina

Don Pasquale, and sang Naiade Ariadne auf Naxos. Yewon Han studied in South Korea, where she graduated from the College of Music of Seoul National University and in 2021-22 she was a member of the Young Artist Program of Korea National Opera. In 2022 Yewon Han performed the role of Adele Die Fledermaus (Tiroler Festspiele Erl.)

#### Joshua Baxter

Laërte, son of Polonius (Tenor)

London-born Tenor Joshua Baxter is a graduate of the University of Aberdeen and the Royal Academy of Music, where he earned a Professional Diploma and MA in Performance. Joshua has performed roles such as Luigi *Il Tabarro*, Don José *Carmen*, and Faust *Faust* across the UK and Europe, including with

Glyndebourne and Buxton International Festival. An accomplished oratorio soloist, he has performed works including Verdi's *Requiem* and Handel's *Messiah*. Recent highlights include soloist appearances at York Proms and with the Bolton Symphony Orchestra.



#### Tylor Lamani

Marcellus (Tenor)

South African born Tamsanqa Tylor Lamani has performed in South Africa and abroad, including Tamino *The Magic Flute* (UCT), Tabaldo *I Capuletti e I Montecchi* (and cover for ETO), Don Basilio/Curzo *The Marriage* of *Figaro* and Nemorino *L'elisir d'Amore*, Cavaradossi *Tosca* (Cape Town Opera), Verdi's Requiem and Handel's Messiah (Cape Town Philharmonic Orchestra), Rinuccio Gianni Schicchi (Operatunity), Alfredo La Traviata (Barefoot Opera). He was a second prize winner in University of Cape Town's Shock Opera competition.



#### Dan D'Souza

Horatio (Baritone)

Anglo-Irish baritone Dan D'Souza made his debut at English National Opera as Belcore The Elixir of Love (Autumn 2024) and is now a Harewood Artist, supported by the inaugural Nicholas Folwell Scholarship. During the 2025/2026 season, he will sing Sid Albert Herring. Previous engagements include Cirillo Fedora and Ibn-Hakia Iolanta (If Opera), Trinculo La Tempesta (Wexford Festival Opera), Apollo Apollo e Dafne (London Handel

Festival), Angelotti *Tosca* (The Grange Festival) and Flemish Deputy *Don Carlo* (Royal Ballet and Opera). Winner of both the Dame Patricia Routledge National English Song Competition and the Royal College of Music Lieder Competition, Dan D'Souza was a laureate for the 2023 Académie Orsay-Royaumont and a prize winner at the 2025 Tenor Viñas Competition.

Ghost of the late King Hamlet (Bass)

Danish bass Per Bach Nissen's latest engagements include King René *Iolanta* (Volksoper Vienna and Salzburg State Theatre), Wirt *Der Schatzgräber* (Opera National du Rhin), Hans Foltz *Meistersinger*, Dr. Bartolo *Il barbiere di Siviglia*, Sagrestano *Tosca*, Jeronimus *Maskarade* and Jens Grand *King and Marschall* (The Royal Danish Opera). Wagner roles include Fafner *Das Rheingold* and Siegfried (Frankfurt Opera), Fasolt *Das* 

Rheingold (Mupa, Budapest) and Pogner Die Meistersinger (Hannover State Opera). Per's debut at Bregenzer Festspiele was as Kardinal Camillo Beatrice Cenci. In the USA his roles have included Rocco Fidelio (Detroit Opera) and Osmin Abduction from the Seraglio (Opera Philadelphia).
